•	Tail, or "stern" set on low, juts out and turns downwards	
•	Being ready to go anywhere and do anything	
•	May have incomplete dentition	
•	Minimum height is 38cm (15ins)	
•	All colour varieties and markings acceptable	
•	Ears erect, but set low	
•	Mouth is always undershot (2 breeds)	
•	Ears may be carried erect or dropped	
•	Coat profuse & dense, of good harsh texture; short hair close, thick & curly	
•	Pure white	
•	Hind feet not lifted high but appear to skim the ground	
•	Desert colours most typical of the breed	
•	Ears likened to a "bat"	
•	Face equally balanced on either side of an imaginary centre-line	
•	Clown-like qualities	
•	Head gives idea of great length and strength of jaw	
•	Colour is whole or smut	
•	Ratio of height to length is 10:11	
•	Body is square	
•	Back short, strong and slightly hollowed	
•	Hindlegs relatively longer than forelegs (2 breeds)	
•	Bite may be scissor or level (pincer)	
•	Has a non-existent coat (very little or no hair)	
•	Gait is light, nimble, active, energetic and very smooth	
•	Gait is lithe, springy and free, covering ground well, head held high

## **WHOSE HEAD??**

1.	Blunt wedge shape of medium length, appearing broader due to low set ears. Skull somewhat
	flattened. Stop shallow but defined. Muzzle sturdy, of moderate length and breadth. Lips tight.
2.	Head square in appearance. Skull nearly flat between ears, domed forehead. Well defined muzzle,
	broad, deep and set back. Lower jaw deep, square, broad and turned up. Upper lip cushioned.
3.	Skull proportionately narrow. Equal breadth throughout whole head. Skull flat. Brows but no abrupt
	stop between them. Foreface long, of equal depth throughout. Lips hang squarely in front.
4.	Skull very large, broad and square. Cheeks well rounded. Forehead flat. Stop broad and deep with
	furrow extending up centre of skull. Nose large, deeply set back almost between the eyes.
5.	Head long and fine with slight peak at the back. Skull not broad, moderate stop. Foreface strong and
	well chiselled, not falling away below the eyes. Chin well defined. Lips tight fitting.
6.	Head broad and strong, wedge-shaped; from above it is wide and elegant, tapering towards the
	muzzle. Skull and muzzle planes almost parallel. Stop slight, but well defined.
7.	Head medium size, without coarseness, moderately broad, slightly rounded. Well defined stop.
	Forehead not protruding. Muzzle pointed, neither thick nor long. Lips firm and black
8.	Medium large head, broad and nearly flat. From above wedge-shaped. Stop moderately defined.
